



Hazel Oak School Sports Premium Funding 2016 – 2017.

Purpose of the Funding

The Government is giving funding to schools for a specific purpose. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Hazel Oak's Sports Premium funding for 2016-2017 is £8,285.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- Supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- Pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

Below is a breakdown of Hazel Oak's Primary Sports Premium Plan for the Academic Year 2016-2017 and its expected impact.

£1460	Solihull School Sports Partnership Membership	Students will be able to take part in a range of extra curricular events such as the South Solihull Dance Festival at Alderbrook School, Chance To Shine 6 week cricket coaching for Y6 from WCC and entry to South Solihull Cricket Festival. PE Co-ordinator will attend 3 training sessions led jointly by Solihull SSP and

Introduction to being an ActiveSchool attended and training around healthy food and physical activity attended.
£700	Cover for teachers.	Hazel Oak teachers are able to attend training sessions to develop their teaching skills and confidence in PE, leading to high quality teaching and learning. Cover is provided by qualified teachers to allow this to happen.
£450	RealGymnastics Training Course	Class teacher attending 2 days to introduce the newest arm of RealPE – Real Gymnastics. He is going to roll this out across school and cascade the training to other PE teachers. New resources for teachers included in this cost.
£225	RealPE Introductory Course.	EYFS teacher attended full day training. Includes a full set of resources for 1 year group.
£108	Yoga mats	New mats purchased to allow students to practice BEAM activities and relaxation without having to get out the large PE mats – quicker and easier. Students have more time to take part in activities and can be more independent at getting out equipment.
£194	Butterfly Primary Table Tennis Pack	New class set of equipment bought to allow us to introduce table tennis to Primary pupils. This will add a new element to PE lessons but also provide more choice for wet playtimes and outdoor play using the concrete table tennis table on the field, increasing the physical activity across school.
£1854	Replace wooden wall bars with new frame and linking poles / ladders.	This will allow the pupils to work through the new RealGym curriculum and develop better Physical Literacy skills / gymnastic skills.

£450	Family FUNS packs x 10	Purchase 10 sets of Family FUNS pack, for parents to use at home with their children. Encouraging more physical activity – working towards 30 minutes a day outside school. Develop pupils overall physical health and physical literacy skills. Parent training session run by HOSTA – more will be offered.
£19	RealPE Evaluation dice and RealGym dice	Purchase these dice packs for use within a lesson to create more ways to develop the students physical and evaluation skills.
£3095	Balanceability bikes, training and other resources	Implementation of Balanceability in Key Stage 1 to support pupils gross motor development and help them develop the vital skills needed in order to learn how to ride a bike.
